1. WELCOME FROM PRESIDENT – Abe Yoffe

- a. Abe called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. The meeting was conducted online using the Zoom meeting app, due to safety considerations during the COVID-19 pandemic crisis. A quorum was established.
- b. Abe welcomed the Council Members who were in attendance via Zoom. A list of those in attendance are noted below. We are pleased so many members of our Council chose to attend this evening's meeting.
- c. Vice President, Kim Shapiro, presented a wonderful PowerPoint presentation on the 2021 year in review of notable items which occurred in the park. This presentation will be posted on the website, along with the approved minutes and it was distributed with the Agenda Packet to all registered participants.

GOVERNANCE

- a. Meeting minutes acceptance from March meeting. The minutes were accepted as written and are posted on the CVPC website: https://cromwellvalleypark.org/about-cvpc/park-council/.
- b. Finance, Kristin McFaul, Treasurer
 - 1) 2022 Financial Documents Receipts Kristin presented the Budget vs. Actual and Balance Sheet reports for the period ending 3/13/22. We are very pleased with our income vs. budget, especially in the area of donations. We anticipate next month's membership income to increase significantly since memberships expire 3/31/23. Currently, we are 25% of budget for dues and 53% of budget for general donations.
 - 2) Kristin noted that the Polliwogs program sold out within an hour. Discussion ensued about increasing the attendance cap from 10 to 15 in order to accommodate more children since the majority of this program will be held outside.
 - 3) Mia presented the fundraising updates which were part of the Board Agenda Packet. For the period January 1 through March 14th, we received 77 membership/donations from 68 donors, totaling \$10,547.52.

- d. Report from Baltimore County Property Management, Bryan Sheppard No Report
- e. Background Checks Abe Yoffe President reported that all Board background checks are current. A listing of expiration dates was included in the Board packet.
- f. Board Elections. The slate was distributed in various methods according to the CVPC Bylaws prior to tonight's meeting. The Nominating Chair, Kelly Emerson, read the slate and the nominating report. Nominations were requested from the floor, but none were presented. The slate of candidates was presented, and voting occurred for the renewal of terms for those people highlighted below. The voting occurred and the slate was accepted unanimously.

3. MANAGEMENT (Committee Reports)

- a. Park Staff Report -Kirk Dreier
 - 1) Primitive Technology weekend is scheduled for May 7th and 8th and Dr. Bill Schindler from National Geographic will be the guest speaker on May 7th. Park Staff has been working to organize this event.
 - 2) Deer culling occurred with 38 deer removed from the Park.
 - 3) Property Management cleaned up the rocks which had washed out of one of the tributaries in June 2021. New grass was also planted at the entrance of Sherwood.
 - 4) Staffing is still in the process for the Seasonal Naturalist position. Ranger Breena will be finishing her temporary posting at the Banneker Museum, which she has been staffing for the last 11 months.
 - 5) School programs are taking place after two years of hiatus and currently 11 schools will begin coming at the end of this month. These are all private schools as public schools are not yet having field trips.
 - 6) Trail Guide Training begins on March 23rd and will be occurring at CVP, Marshy Point and Banneker.
- b. Leaseholder's Report Talmar, Kate Joyce
 - 1) Preparation for spring plantings have been occurring and Talmar is looking forward to new programming in the spring.
- d. Buildings and Grounds Rick Childs
 - 1) The riding mower was received in March. The Billy Goat mower was approved to purchase and should be arriving soon. The Trails Committee has been off to a great start using the new equipment.
- e. Programs Kelly Emerson.
 - 1) PPI's Gilchrist's Steps of Hope event is moving forward for June 12th. Kelly will let the Council know what type of assistance will be needed.
 - 2) The Baltimore Road Runners Club held a very successful Superbowl Run, despite the snow which decided to bless our park that morning.
 - 3) The Towson Arts Council event was discussed, including what volunteer expectations the TAC would expect from CVPC, given that the Migration Celebration event will be held the following weekend.
- f. Volunteers for Pat Novak Kim reported the board member volunteer hours total for the month of February

included 138 hours, including planning for Migration Celebration, meetings and Diversity and Inclusion efforts.

- g. Membership Kim Our numbers for this month in 2022 at 531 are significantly higher than the previous 4 years, each under 400. This is an addition of 15 members from the prior month's report.
- h. Communications Mia Walsh
 - 1) Our total followers on Instagram is now 1,456, an increase of 1.7% from the prior month.
 - 2) Our most popular Facebook posts included the deer skull post, the American Mink photos and our call for newspaper for the animal cages. We reached 6,700 persons and had 2,700 engagements in the last 30 days.
 - 3) The Annual Report has been completed and printed. It will be mailed out in April.
- i. Volunteers Pat Novak / Kim Shapiro
 - 1) Pat and Kim discussed the various volunteer opportunities available within the Council. There are opportunities for recurring, one day or several hours, with both weekend and weekday possibilities.

j. Ad Hoc Committees:

- 1) Migration Celebration Kim Shapiro Kim gave an update on the Migration Celebration planning, which continues to have a lot of support from within CVPC. Kristin mentioned that McFaul's will have a new food truck available by that time and that CVPC should consider utilizing that as a source. The lack of food / drinks was one item that the Council would like to address for 2022.
- 2) Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Abe Yoffe Pat and Abe met regarding this topic. When an open position becomes available on the Board, we would like to widen the diversity of our board to reflect the membership and park visitors more accurately.

- c. Cemetery Research-Sya Kedzior Sya did not have additional updates from the prior month.
- d. Weed Warrior Leadership Abe was pleased to announce that Laurie Taylor-Mitchell has again agreed to take on this role, with the assistance of a second in command. She would like to see more Council members participate in this program.
- e. Citizen Generated Request for Stream Bridges Abe Yoffe Abe stated that Ben Porter is aware of this request and will be on his items to address in the near future.
- f. Adult Programming Kim Shapiro. The Council is pleased the Park Staff added the Senior Stroll program beginning in May for those 55+ to get in nature for a lovely walk. In addition, the Department of Aging is hosting their Free & Friendly Forest Meetups on Tuesdays at noon from March 29th May 3rd.
